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ST FRANCIS OF ASSISI HUB MASS

On the 4th October, as we came to the end of the season of creation, the St Francis of Assisi Hub celebrated their annual Hub Mass celebration on St Francis of Assisi's Feast Day! This year it was The Becket School's turn to host the Hub Mass and we were very excited to welcome Fr Wilfred to celebrate our Mass and invite our family of feeder primary schools to celebrate the Mass with us virtually.

Each school in the hub created their own Mass parts which included: a brilliant introduction and scripture reflection by Our Lady and St Edwards; a beautifully sung Penitential Act by St Edmund Campion; a beautifully sung Psalm by St Patrick's school; some lovely and thoughtful prayers of intercession by English Martyrs school, a peaceful and meditative communion reflection based on St Francis of Assisi's prayer by Blessed Robert Widmerpool and our joyful prayers of thanksgiving by students from 8B, 8E and 8N at The Becket School. For the first time in a long while we also had live music led by the music department and our talented Y12 music students!

In our Hub Mass we reflected on the theme of Building the Kingdom of God and thought about the ways in which St Francis was called to build God's kingdom here on earth. Fr Wilfred encouraged us to find inspiration from St Francis and seek to be a saint for the poor, the vulnerable and the environment.

OUR LADY OF THE HOLY ROSARY RETREAT AFTERNOON

In the Church, October is also a month dedicated to the Holy Rosary and on the 7th October, the Catholic Church celebrated the feast of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary. October helps to remind us that we can look to Mary not only as an example, but also as a friend who prays with us when we need her the most.

On this special feast day, in our morning form time prayer, every young person and staff member had the opportunity to create their very own decade of the rosary with pieces of string and then pray the rosary together as a form. We tied 11 knots in our pieces of string to help guide us through the Our Father, ten Hail Mary's and the Glory Be prayers that make up a decade of the rosary. It was great to hear that so many forms thoroughly enjoyed creating their own decade of the rosary!





During the afternoon we celebrated and explored the rosary some more as some of our Y8 and Y9 RE classes visited the chapel for a session on the rosary with chaplains Joe and Ruth. We were also joined by Fr Michael and our past chair of governors Les Sullivan.

During our rosary afternoon with Y8 and Y9, we tested our knowledge on the rosary with a quiz and then we split into teams to create reflections on each of the pieces of scripture that make up the joyful mysteries. Y8 and 9 created some beautiful and thought provoking reflections in the form of freeze frames, dramas, hot seating, reflective questions and prayers which helped us to journey with Mary and Jesus throughout Jesus' childhood. After Y8 and 9 shared their joyful reflections with the rest of the groups, we finished the afternoon by praying a decade of the rosary together. We were given the mission to learn more about the different mysteries that make up the rosary and to try praying the rosary more in the month of October.

ALL SAINTS' DAY MASS

On the Solemnity of All Saints' Day we celebrated all the men and women who in their life, and often their death, set an example of how to live a life for God. They give hope to us all that we can be better people and one day even become saints ourselves! On the 1st November we joined together in person and virtually after our October Half Term for an All Saints' Day celebration of Mass! We were very lucky and thrilled to have our music led by the very talented Miss Magee and Mr Ryder.

We were joined by Fr Michael Brown who celebrated our Mass and led us through a thought provoking homily linked to COP26. Fr Michael encouraged and supported us in using our voices to reclaim our common home and protect our planet for future generations. We were reminded that we all have the power to be modern day saints!



On Tuesday the 2nd of November we celebrated the Feast of All Souls, a day to pray for and celebrate all the souls who have died. All the Chaplains in the OLoL Trust led a virtual Liturgy for our primary and secondary schools.

The Liturgies were based on John 14:1-6, 'There are many rooms in my Father's house.' We reflected on those who are at rest in heaven with God and took comfort in knowing that there are rooms for us all in heaven, where our father will welcome us to eternal life.

Each student thought about what a room would look like in the Kingdom of heaven and we filled the image of a house with the names of people we wanted to pray for during the month of remembrance.

YEAR 11 RETREAT DAY — FAITH AND WELL-BEING

On Friday 5th November, year 11 took a step away from the business of school life for their final retreat day as a year group. It had been a while since we were able to gather together for a retreat, which made the day even more special to be a part of.

The theme of the day was faith and well-being — we retreated from our worries and spent the day focusing and exploring the ways we can look after our faith, our mental wellbeing and how we can look after one another in our final year together. 
SYNOD 2021-2023 - https://www.synod.va/en.html

In October, Pope Francis launched a Synod of the whole Church, in which he asks that everyone in the Church listen to the voice of the Holy Spirit and dream and think of the type of Church we wish to be a part of. Along with all the bishops in the world, Bishop Patrick has asked each part of the Nottingham diocese (parishes, chaplaincies, communities and schools) to be very involved in this listening and journeying process, so that as many voices as possible can be heard. Pope Francis and Bishop Patrick are very passionate about hearing the voices of young people, who are the future of our church. They want to hear **your** voice - whether you are a regular church goer, or if you haven't been for a while!

Six questions have been posed to our schools for our young people to answer. We will be answering these questions each Friday during the season of Advent in our morning form time prayer and then we will share our responses with our local parish, deanery, parents and carers in the New Year. Each student will be presented with two Synod Prayer Cards, one to be kept and used in personal prayer as regularly as possible, and the other is to be given to someone else who might be a bit distant from the Church.

We look forward to updating you further on our Synod journey and hearing our young people's voices on what they dream the future of the church to look like!











WORLD YOUTH FUNDAY

On Friday 19th November, we celebrated World Youth Funday (the Friday before Christ the King Sunday). We marked this day with a non-uniform day and asked students to bring in £1 to help raise money for the Nottingham Diocesan Catholic Youth Service (NDCYS) and The Briars who support thousands of young people virtually and on retreat in exploring themselves, their faith and friendships in fun and meaningful ways.

Excitingly, Pope Francis has announced that the Feast of Christ the King will be an international day of prayer for young people every year- so "National Youth Sunday" is now "World Youth Sunday"! For Youth Friday and Youth Sunday we joined in prayer with young people around the world, celebrating our universal faith and unpacking the international theme: "Stand up! You are appointed as a witness for what you have seen!" based on Acts 26:16.

In school, the members of our chaplaincy team took part in the World Youth Funday livestream and were invited to attend our voluntary Friday lunchtime Mass where our new members of the team were commissioned and all members of the Chaplaincy team were given a special blessing by Fr Jonathan Cotton. 
