ADVENT FUNDRAISING

The start of the Advent Season also saw the launch of our Advent fundraising appeals. For the past four weeks, students and staff have been generously donating non-perishable food items and toiletries for those who are supported by the charity Refugee Roots: <u>https://www.refugeeroots.org.uk/</u> Refugee Roots is a Christian Charity, based in Nottingham, that helps asylum seekers and refugees build relationships and navigate the complexities of building a new life in the UK.

Mr Pickup, who is the Treasurer on the board of Trustees for Refugee Roots wanted to pass on this message: "On Friday 16th December, Joe (Chaplain), Mrs Conlon (RE teacher) and Mr Pickup (Maths teacher) visited Refugee Roots with four of our Year 12 students to drop off all of the food and sanitary donations. The students who travelled, representing the Justice and Peace Group were Anna Bayley, Caitlin Collins, James Foody and Alice Hill. As a school we have donated almost 1000 items, and these will be packed into parcels to be distributed to struggling families over the Christmas period. We know every human being is made in the image of God and every human being deserves a life of dignity and respect. The Justice and Peace group wishes to raise awareness of the injustices in both our global and local communities and we are striving to make this vision of a harmonious world where every human being is valued, a reality.

The justice and peace group have achieved some incredible things this academic year and that would not have been possible without our students and families' support and generosity...

In October, the Justice and Peace team hosted three cake sales during lunchtimes, where we raised over £350 for the people of Pakistan to support families in their desperation due to the horrendous flooding. This paid for emergency shelter, food and clothing for people who had lost everything.

Later that month, we also raised an incredible £152.39 for CAFOD from our Family Fast Day where our students enjoyed a cup of soup and a bread roll. You were living simply so others may simply live. This amazing amount of money also includes the money raised through your small change CAFOD box donations from our first half term. So that is over £500 raised from your giving!



ST BERNADETTE'S RELIC TOUR

During September and October of 2022, the relics of St Bernadette toured the UK for the first time ever with the mission of welcoming people back into the church! This was a truly joyful experience for the Church and the relics of saints are special to the Catholic Church because they give Catholics a tangible link to heaven. When venerating and praying through the saints, we can feel closer to God and inspired to be brave like St Bernadette.

One of our very own Chaplains, Joe Martin, worked throughout the tour of St Bernadette's Relics as the content provider, which meant that Joe documented the tour with photographs and videos. We asked Joe about his experience on the tour and what his favourite memories are...

"I absolutely loved meeting so many different people throughout the tour and speaking to them about what brought them to the relics of St Bernadette. I met Catholics, people of different faiths and people of no faith, who were curious to see what was happening in the church! A special memory of mine would have to be when I met a man from Ukraine, who had flown to London from Ukraine that morning. He knew how important and special the opportunity would be to venerate St Bernadette's relics. He flew back to Ukraine that evening not knowing what he was going to be greeted with but asked for our prayers, for not only Ukraine, but the whole world. A personal take away from the tour, for me, is to remember the power of prayer." - Joe, Lay Chaplain.

On day two of St Bernadette's Relics tour at Nottingham Cathedral, some of our staff and students attended the Mass of thanksgiving with Bishop Patrick. We were so proud of the students who attended the Mass; they conducted themselves brilliantly and got involved with the Mass parts beautifully. We hope they will treasure this moment and will feel inspired to come on pilgrimage to Lourdes (the place where Our Lady appeared to Bernadette) when they are in year 12!
