## YEAR 7 EPIPHANY LITURGICAL WORKSHOP










# **YEAR 10 RETREAT DAY**



## YEAR 10 LEAD US THROUGH THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorate Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man.

Y10 brought the Stations of the Cross to life in a very powerful and emotive way through the use of drama, reflection and prayer. ## SHADOW SYNDICATE PRESENTS "FALLEN"

In our final week of the Lent term, "Shadow's Syndicate", The Becket's theatre production team, performed their first performance in front of a live audience since December 2019. "Fallen" is an interpretation of the events that took place leading up to Jesus' crucifixion. This particular depiction included: some of the miracles performed by Jesus, a conflicted Pilate, a disconsolate Judas and the conspiratorial angle of the priests against Jesus.

The actors were made up of students from year 7 – 10, some of whom are studying their Drama GSCE and others who are involved for their sheer love of theatre. The young people took real ownership over the communication of the narrative, characterisation and production values and formed many new friendships with one another along the way.

Mr Lund was particularly proud of the cast who had given many hours of dedication to the performance, "Fallen is the culmination of many hours of practical rehearsal from these actors, who deserve every accolade they receive for the creative and imaginative spirit with which they have approached this production.
