ASH WEDNESDAY

We started our Lenten journey together on Ash Wednesday, when we were led beautifully in a Liturgical Prayer by some of our year 10, year 11 and sixth form students. We were reminded of the three pillars of Lent:

FASTING

In Lent, we give up indulging in materialistic or worldly things, such as: social media, fast fashion, foods, swearing, gossiping, playing video games - the list goes on! This helps us to spend more time deepening our relationship with God and the people around us.

PRAYER

We make an effort to spend more time in prayer with God to become closer to Him and to have a better understanding of what God is calling us to do as his disciples.

ALMSGIVING

We become more Christ-like through giving to others in need, we can give of our time through acts of kindness, our prayer intentions and we can give of our money, clothes, and food items.

This Lent has seen an incredible amount of almsgiving and charitable awareness in our community. SIXTH FORM PILGRIMAGE TO LOURDES In July 2023, the youth contingent of the Nottingham Diocese will finally be returning to Lourdes! A group of Becket Sixth Form students have put themselves forward for the pilgrimage and they will be embarking on this adventure from midnight on Saturday 15th July - Thursday 20th July. The Nottingham Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes sees hundreds of people from across the diocese journey on pilgrimage to the shrine of Our Lady in Lourdes in France, where Our Lady appeared to St Bernadette 18 times! Now, over 7 million people visit Lourdes each year, many of whom pilgrimage to receive physical or mental healing.

During our Diocesan pilgrimage, our Sixth Form helpers will be putting their faith into action through helping serve the sick and less able members of our diocese, as well as meeting new people, building friendships and experiencing the healing and peace that is found in Lourdes.


